
### CITISTATSMART – MAKING BALTIMORE SAFE








#### VIOLENT & PROPERTY CRIME CLEARANCE RATES BY YEAR




# BALTIMORE CITY VIOLENT CRIME CLEARANCES BY TYPE OF OFFENSE (2008-2017 ESTIMATE)




# HOMICIDE CLEARANCE RATES (2008-2017 ESTIMATE)


