


## • Making Progress

o **Demolitions.** The chart below displays the total number of demolitions completed in CY15. The total number of demolitions for the year has already exceeded the total numbers from CY13 and CY 14.





- Promote Homeownership. Homeownership incentive programs rebounded from a slow September. The CDBG Program, Live Near Your Work, and the Buying into Baltimore program all made substantial improvements. Improvements have been made through improved targeting strategies, as well as a re-arrangement of staff to fully support the incentive programs. Progress can be seen in the chart below.
  - Homeownership incentive numbers in October fluctuated. The number of applications
    received doubled and the number of settlements improved, however the total number of
    workshop participants fell dramatically.
  - The average dollar amount per approved applicant increased by \$500 in October.
  - We are on track to exceed the FY15 outputs for homeownership.





## • Needs Improvement

• Weatherization. The Weatherization Program provides energy efficient home improvements to low-income residents of Baltimore City. Servicing homes to be more energy efficient conserves energy, reduces utility bills, and makes homes healthier, cleaner and more stable. The following chart displays totals for each month (not cumulative). The department is exploring the idea of expanding contractor capacity to weatherize units at a greater amount per month.
