
- Making Progress
- Available Street Sweepers. DGS monitors the availability of all vehicles, including those designated as priority vehicles. Priority vehicles consist of medic units, ladder trucks, pumper engines, marked police, load packers, roll-offs, and sweepers. During the last reporting period, sweeper availability was **under** 100% all but one day. Conversely, from December 24, 2015 to January 6, 2016 sweeper availability was **over** 100% all but one day.

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• **Preventative Maintenance Pilot.** The Fleet Management Division (FMD) conducts Preventative Maintenance (PM) on vehicles and other equipment to extend their durability. FMD began a pilot utilizing one crew exclusively for PM work orders. This PM crew of five employees involves performing PMs and small repairs off PMs. The chart below shows that from July 2015 to December 2016 the average time it took for the first labor entry to occur has decreased in half, from 16.3 days to 7.8 days.



- <u>Needs Improvement</u>
 - **Facilities Maintenance Work Orders.** The Department of General Services (DGS) utilizes Archibus software to manage their facilities maintenance workflow. While the system tracks work orders well, informative performance measures are not available. DGS will continue to meet to discuss establishing performance benchmarks that can be captured in Archibus.
 - Sequel Server Reporting Services (SSRS): DGS is working to provide monthly invoice reports to agency officials broken down by individual charges. Originally, the process required a different link be sent for each monthly report. The Mayor's Office of Information Technology (MOIT) created one link to an agency folder where an agency official can choose from any of the available reports. After providing fiscal personnel from all major agencies with the report, DGS will make any necessary changes to the report.
