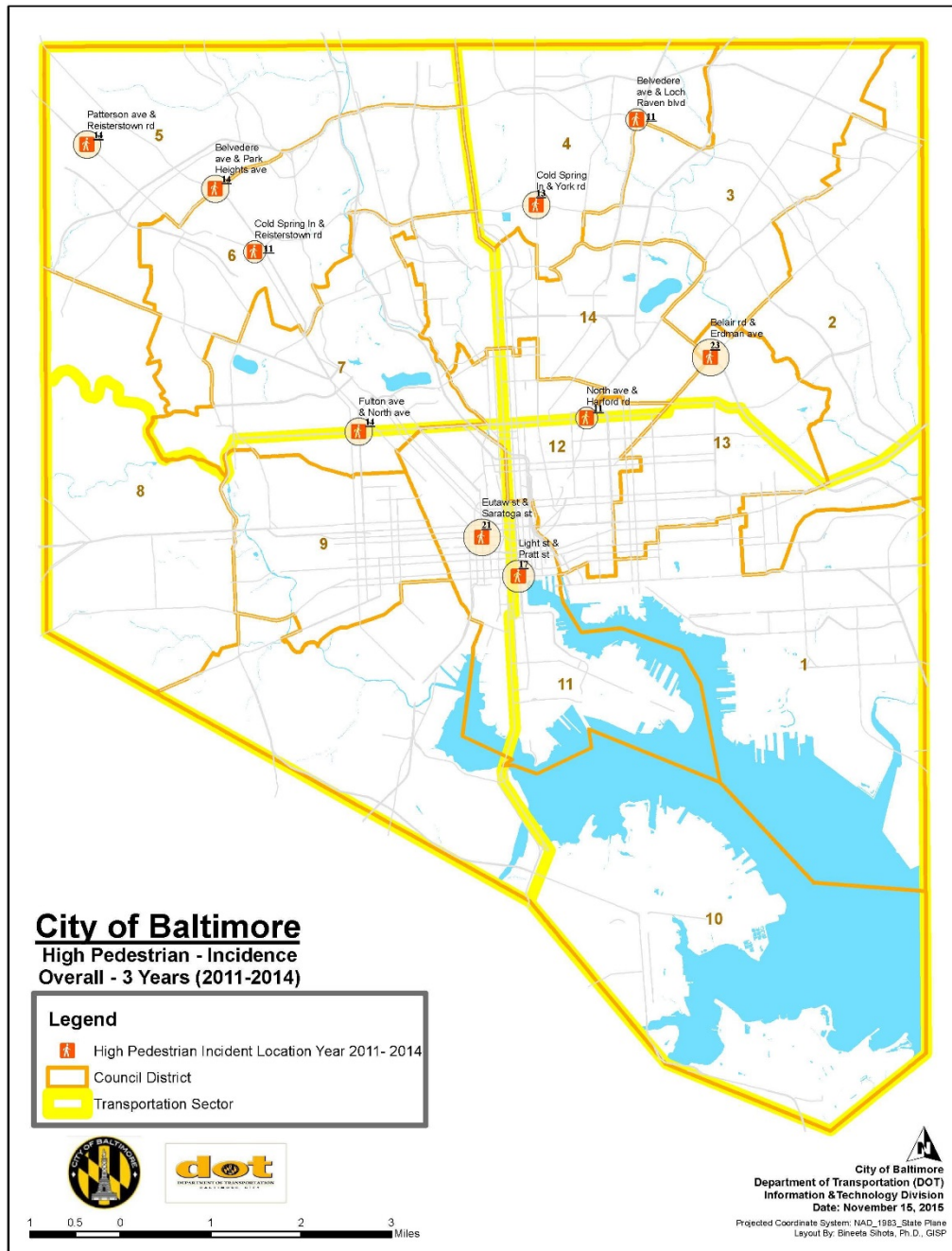

• **Making Progress**

- **Toward Zero.** The Department of Transportation (DOT) hosted a Toward Zero Baltimore Interagency Workgroup in order to develop a comprehensive action plan for addressing roadway safety, with specialized focus areas of Education, Engineering, Enforcement, and considering other areas such as technology and innovation, evaluation, advocacy and policy advancement. The ultimate goal is to move Baltimore towards zero pedestrian traffic fatalities and severe injuries. Pictured on the next page is a map of the top 10 locations citywide with the highest number of pedestrian-involved crashes.



- **Needs Improvement**

- **Abandoned Vehicles.** CitiStat tracks and monitors all of the data coming into the 311 system in order to keep tabs on the amount of requests received and the amount of time it takes to resolve a request. The Department of Transportation data template shows that the closed on time percentage for responding to abandoned vehicle complaints has dipped from 78% to 70%.
